General Responsibilities

- Encourage individuals to become supporters/members of Project Coyote.

Educator Responsibilities and Program Support

- Learn and develop knowledge on the basics of coyote behavior, human-wildlife coexistence, and the role of carnivores in the ecosystem.
- Lead a variety of KIW educational programs for kids and families e.g. presentations, games, virtual visits, tabling, and more.
- Assist with the planning and organization of KIW events and activities in coordination with the Education & Outreach Manager and other KIW volunteers.
- Stay up to date on North American carnivores, youth educational methods, and local conservation issues to help create the best possible learning and teaching environment

- Assist in answering questions from the public about KIW and Project Coyote resources by working with Communication and Programmatic Staff.
