- Distribute Project Coyote resources and campaign materials
- Encourage individuals to become supporters/members of Project Coyote

Potential Responsibilities, Depending on Volunteer Best Fit

Project Coyote works to PROTECT wild carnivores through advocacy campaigns, teach communities to compassionately COEXIST with their wild neighbors through outreach initiatives, and INSPIRE appreciation for wild nature through partnerships with educators and creatives.

PROTECT: Advocacy Campaigns

- Assist in researching and identifying state-specific policy priorities for wild carnivore protection
- Advance Project Coyote's PROTECT campaigns, including:
 - Ending Wildlife Killing Contests
 - o Protect America's Wolves
 - Reforming Wildlife Governance
 - Science & Ethics
- Draft Action Alert emails and other local outreach materials for state supporters about pressing carnivore policy issues
- Write and submit letters to the editor and op-eds to relevant media outlets in support of carnivore protection policy

INSPIRE: Appreciation for Wild Nature

- Organize wildlife appreciation speaking and art events, e.g. screenings of Project Coyote's films
- Expand the reach of Keeping It Wild educational resources
- Support Project Coyote's fundraising events and campaigns
- Create content to inspire public engagement with wildlife conservation
- Pitch media content to media outlets and potential media collaborators to promote Project Coyote's mission and work

Qualifications and Skills

- Excellent organization and communication skills (verbal and written)
- Ability to work both independently and in a collaborative environment
- Computer literacy, including proficiency with Google Drive, Zoom, and Slack
- High level of knowledge or experience working in wildlife advocacy, or dedication to learning
- Passion for and dedication to the mission and goals of Project Coyote

Time Commitment

- Average of 5 volunteer hours per week (or ~20 volunteer hours per month), understanding that time may vary based on campaigns and personal availability
- Minimum commitment of six months, with longer-term service preferred
- Annual review process

Application Process

- 1. Apply here by April 30, 2025 (including submitting references)
- 2. Participate in an interview with State Coordinator and State Advocacy Manager
- 3. Complete reference check
- 4. Receive offer of volunteer position, including training and ongoing support
